Re: Department Regulations on Using or Discharging Firearms in a Small Portion of the Hatcher Pass Special Use Area Opportunity to Comment on Proposed Regulation Changes

Dear Alaskan:

The Department of Natural Resources proposes to adopt a regulation change in Title 11 of the Alaska Administrative Code dealing with the use or discharge of firearms in a small portion of the Hatcher Pass Special Use Area, to allow for a possible biathlon range in the Government Peak Unit of the Hatcher Pass Management Plan. I am writing to explain the proposed changes to these regulations, why we are proposing this regulation package now, and how this action relates to the ongoing resource management process. I invite you to review and comment on these proposed regulations.

Brief Description

After considering public comments, ideas, and suggestions received pursuant to the notice of public scoping under Administrative Order 266, the Department of Natural Resources is proposing to amend 11 AAC 96.014(b)(3)(E) to allow for the use or discharge of firearms associated with a possible biathlon range within a small portion of the Hatcher Pass Special Use Area, specifically the Southern Development Area of the Government Peak Unit of the Hatcher Pass Management Plan, as depicted on the map entitled Hatcher Pass Management Plan, Government Peak Unit, Southern Development Area, Biathlon Range Area.

Why Do We Need This Regulation Change Now?

The Matanuska-Susitna Borough is considering installing a biathlon range on boroughowned lands within a portion of the Southern Development Area of the Government Peak Unit of the Hatcher Pass Management Plan. These proposed regulations are needed to allow shooting associated with this proposed biathlon range. Under current regulations, a person may not use or discharge a firearm within this area except for lawful hunting.

While the subject lands are owned by the Matanuska-Susitna Borough, the Borough is required to manage these lands under DNR regulations and DNR's Hatcher Pass Management Plan. DNR must therefore, revise this existing regulation in order to allow for the use or discharge of firearms associated with the borough's possible biathlon range.

Opportunity for Comment.

Interested parties are encouraged to review the proposed regulation changes and submit any comments to the Division of Mining, Land and Water. Enclosed is the official "Notice of Proposed Changes in the Regulations of the Department of Natural Resources," which provides the details regarding the submission of public comment.
