The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Health and Social Services against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Department of Health and Social Services after the close of the public comment period. The regulations concern mental health physician clinic requirements as relates to Medicaid coverage for behavioral health services. Specifically, the regulations amend 7 AAC 135.030(d) regarding requirements for payment of behavioral health clinic services and make other changes to 7 AAC 135 related to provider requirements.

The March 7, 2019, public notice and the October 3, 2019, adoption order both state that this action is expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is included as part of this regulations packet and the anticipated amount was included in the additional regulation notice information.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations. Our edit to 7 AAC 135.030(d)(3)(E) reflects the statutory change from "advanced nurse practitioner" to "advanced practice registered nurse" in AS 08.68.
