The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Education and Early Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations concern updated standards, adopted by reference, for Alaska students for science, computer science, digital literacy, and content and performance standards.

The Department of Education and Early Development noticed the regulation changes as three separate projects, but adopted one set of regulations to incorporate the changes. The department published public notice on April 14, 2019, notifying the public of the proposed updated standards. Although the department published three separate notices, the regulation changes are all incorporated into one adoption order. The certification of adoption states that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.
