Therapists (12 AAC 02.396)

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development after the close of the public comment period.

The regulations establish fees for massage therapy establishments, now subject to regulation by the Board of Massage Therapists as a result of amendments to AS 08.61.020 made under sec. 2., ch. 10, SLA 2018 and effective July 1, 2019. The regulations establish a \$300 registration fee for a massage therapy establishment. If a massage therapy establishment is unregistered, the regulations impose a \$2,000 fee on the establishment for each investigation of the premises.

We note that these fee regulations are related to a set of substantive regulation changes that include new regulations for massage therapy establishments (Department of Law file number 2018201001). We ask that the set of substantive regulations be filed on the same date as this fee regulation project so that the regulations in each project share the same effective date (i.e., 30 days after the date of filing).

The October 27, 2019 public notice and the January 17, 2020 adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.


