Question #1

Contract Period:

Would the State agree to base the option years on mutual consent instead of sole consent?

Price Adjustments:

Would the State agree to base price adjustments on changes in raw material costs to the Vendor?

Price Adjustments:

If the State will not agree to base price adjustments on changes in raw material costs and an index is required, would the State agree to base price adjustments on the IHS Chemical Global Monthly Market Summary as the Vendor's products are not on the CPI?

Certified Independent Lab Tests dated within 24 months:

Would the State revise this requirement to “dated within 48 months” as this is the standard requalification requirement for AMS1435 after the initial qualification? For example, if a product is initially qualified in 2019, it would need to be requalified in 2021 and again in 2025.

Answer #6

The ITB Page 10. Evidence of Compliance Section is modified to read as follows:

EVIDENCE OF COMPLIANCE: Bidders must submit written confirmation with their bid that the product offered meets the specifications set forth in this ITB.

Bidders must submit the following with their bid:

1. Material Safety Data Sheets;
2. Certified independent laboratory test results from the manufacturer’s initial preproduction test for the offered chemical. Test results must demonstrate clear indication that the offered chemical conforms to each specification set forth in this ITB; and
3. The most recent certified independent laboratory periodic test results. Test results must demonstrate clear indication that the offered chemical conforms to each specification set forth in this ITB

The State reserves the right to verify and approve evidence of compliance.

The Bidder’s failure to submit the above evidence with their bid may cause the State to determine the bid non-responsive and reject the bid.

Throughout the contract term, the Contractor must submit proof of certified lab results within thirty (30) days of the State’s written request.

Question #7

Invoices; 3. Signed delivery receipts must accompany invoices:

Would the State remove the requirement to send signed delivery receipts with invoices? Allowing this removal will expedite the invoicing process as there is a delay between the time of delivery and receiving signed copies of delivery receipts.

Answer #7

Question #8

Shipping Costs Reimbursement:

Will the State agree to the same shipping fees process for the entire contract? For example, shipping and handling billed as prepaid and add in the bid submittal and for years two (2) through four (4), or allow a delivered price (shipping and handling included) in the bid submittal with an annual price adjustment clause during years two (2) through four (4).
