3. High Visibility Clothing. The Department requires all workers within the project limits to wear an outer visible surface or layer of high visibility color and retroreflectivity.
4. Prevailing Wage Requirements. The Lt. Governor certified the revised regulatory definition of "on-site" in 8 AAC 30.910 to clarify the scope of activities covered by Alaska's Little Davis Bacon Act (AS 36.05.010 - AS 36.05.110) as proposed by the Department of Labor and Workforce Development (DOLWD) proposed a. Construction on the bridge crossing may be underway and access may be limited to foot or ATV access only.
