(12 AAC 68.500(b)(2); 12 AAC 68.930; 12 AAC 68.990(4))

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Board of Veterinary Examiners against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Board of Veterinary Examiners after the close of the public comment period. The regulations repeal a reference to a student permit fee, address the requirement for licensed veterinarians to register with the prescription drug monitoring program (PDMP) controlled substance prescription database under AS 17.30.200, and make a technical update to a definition.

We note that this project is related to a Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development set of proposed amendments to Board of Veterinary Examiners fees under 12 AAC 02.350; that project includes a proposed repeal of the student permit fee (Department of Law file number 2020200226). The deadline for receiving public comments on those regulations was March 27, 2020.

We also note that the Board of Veterinary Examiners withdrew from the final regulations provisions relating to temporary licenses, temporary permits, veterinary-client-patient relationships, and veterinary medical clinics.

The June 10, 2019 public notice and the March 19, 2020 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The correction are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.

- 5. 12 AAC 68.930. Registration with the prescription drug monitoring program controlled substance prescription database, is a proposed new section requiring registration with the prescription drug monitoring program controlled substance prescription database (PDMP).
- **6. 12 AAC 68.940. Veterinary medical facility**, is a proposed new section establishing requirements for a veterinary medical facility to designate a licensed veterinarian as the manager of the facility.
- 7. 12 AAC 68.990. Definitions, is being proposed to amend current definitions and add a definition for "veterinary medical facility" and "veterinary facility".
