The bid documents require acknowledgment individually of all addenda to the drawings and/or specifications. This is a mandatory requirement and any quote received without acknowledgment of receipt of addenda may be classified as not being a responsive bid. If, by virtue of this addendum it is desired to modify a quote already submitted, such modification may be made by telegram or telefacsimile provided such a telegram or telefacsimile makes reference to this addendum and is received prior to the opening hour and date specified above.

The Bid Date is modified as follows:

The Contract Documents are modified as follows:

<u>Replace</u> Form 25D-07DNR (07/18, 01/19) Invitation to Bid with the modified Invitation to Bid form (Addendum No. 3 – Attachment A)

<u>Replace</u> Form 25D-10HDNR (01/15, 01/19) Construction Contract with the modified Construction Contract form (Addendum No. 3 – Attachment B)

The Special Provisions are modified as follows:

Replace 201-1.01 DESCRIPTION with the following:

201-1.01 DESCRIPTION. Clear, grub, and remove all vegetation and debris within grading limits and stockpile areas as indicated on the plans and identified by the Engineer.

<u>Replace the first paragraph of 201-3.07</u>, SALVAGE SOIL AND ORGANICS <u>with the following</u>: Remove and salvage all stumps, roots, moss, grass, turf, debris, and other ground cover to a depth less than 4 feet below finish grade.

680-5.01 BASIS OF PAYMENT, add the following:

This includes all Riprap, Class I material incorporated into the detention pond.

Add the following as Supplemental Information:

Additional Cross Sections (See Addendum No. 3 - Attachment D).

The Bid Documents are clarified as follows:

- Q1: Subsection 203-1.01 and 203-2.01 states "all materials of whatever character encountered in the work is paid for under Item 203(1) Unclassified Excavation, however Subsection 620-5.01 states that "stockpiling of topsoil and organic materials" is paid under Item 620(1) Topsoil. Is the excavation of organic soil, which would be stockpiled for later as topsoil, paid for under the unclassified excavation item?
- **A1:** Removal and stockpile of waste organic material would be paid for under Item 201(3A) Clearing and Grubbing, Item 203(3) Unclassified Excavation, and/or under Item 620(1) Topsoil depending on the source of the material and how it is handled.
- Q2: Is the gravel sourced from useable excavation for use as topsoil blend material paid for as unclassified excavation?
- **A2:** No. Item 203(3) Unclassified Excavation includes excavation and embankment of useable excavation as well as work listed under Subsection 203-5.01. Item 620(1) Topsoil includes all material and resources to meet the requirements of Section 726. If topsoil uses useable excavation, including blended gravel and sand material, it requires pre-approval and needs to be backed out of the quantity of unclassified excavation quantity. This can be accomplished by surveying the gravel quantity prior to processing as indicated in Subsection 620-5.01.
- Q3: Is the contractor paid for all riprap used on the project per ton? Whether rock lined ditches or used in the construction of the Detention Pond.
- A3: No. All Riprap in the channels is included in the tonnage quantity. Since the configuration of the detention pond can vary depending on the layout, the riprap incorporated is subsidiary to Item 680(1) Detention Pond.
- Q4: Please provide quantity calculations or more cross-sections, in order to double check the quantity of usable excavation. There is concern that spec 203.-3.03 "the former out of pit spoil pile shown on the plans is available should the material within grading limits be insufficient to complete final grade, or for benching interim fill slope.", will hold contractors to retrieving material from the out-of-pit spoil pile should they run out of usable ex. Estimating how much material will be hauled from the out-of-pit spoil is the main concern as it would be more expensive than simply lowering the FG or using what was available from the cut.
- **A4**: See attached supplemental information. Unclassified excavation quantities provided allow the materials to balance. However, if a Contractor chooses to utilize a significant amount of the useable excavation for other purposes, additional excavation from the out of spoil pile could be anticipated.
- Q5: Please confirm grubbing is not required where FG is to be 4 feet or more from OG or 4+ feet of fill is required?
- **A5**: Correct. Per Subsection 201-3.03, grubbing is required within excavation limits and within fill limits where embankments will be less than 4 feet deep, however clearing is required per subsection 201-3.02.
- Q6: Why are the clearing & grubbing limits far beyond the grading limits (north side)?
- **A6**: To provide an access to the North side of the pit and a stockpile area for salvaged vegetation and organic materials for topsoil production. Per Subsection 201-5.01, the clearing and grubbing for this approved area is included in the quantities for Item 201(3A) Clearing and Grubbing.

Q7: Is it the intention to utilize existing grubbing, salvaged vegetation, and gravels for Topsoil or is it the intention to meet the 726 Spec with sieve requirements, fertilizer, and limestone?

A7: It is the intent to utilize the existing organic material and vegetation, with the option to use the existing sand and gravel. Section 726 has been updated to provide clarification.

Q8: Are there any special provisions for the Flexible Growth Medium? The is just reference to the standard specifications in section 727-2.01 Mulch.

A8: There are no special provisions. Flexible Growth Media (FGM) is the standard mulch requirement.
