The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Division of Insurance against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulation makes permanent the emergency regulation to add cardio-respiratory failure and shock, including respiratory distress syndromes, to the list of covered conditions under Alaska's Comprehensive Health Insurance Association Reinsurance Program.

The May 14, 2020, public notice and March 25, 2020, emergency adoption order state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required. The July 6, 2020, certification of compliance states that the division paid special attention to the costs to private persons when considering public comments.

We made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.
