OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES

The attached 7 pages of regulations, dealing with Embalming & Other Post-Mortem Services; Medicolegal Death Investigation (7 AAC 35.500- .590), are adopted and certified to be a correct copy of the regulation changes that the Department of Health and Social Services adopts under the authority of AS 12.65.005, AS 12.65.015, AS 12.65.020, AS 13.75.020, AS 18.05.040, and after compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62), specifically including notice under AS 44.62.190 and 44.62.200 and opportunity for public comment under AS 44.62.210.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.

Although no public comments were received, the Department of Health & Social Services paid special attention to the cost to private persons of the regulatory action being taken.

The regulation changes adopted under this order take effect on the 30th day after they have been filed by the lieutenant governor, as provided in AS 44.62.180.

7 AAC 35 is amended by adding new sections to read:

3. Autopsies, State Medical Examiner Office [GENERAL PROVISIONS] (7 AAC 35.200 - 7 AAC 35.290)
4. Medicolegal Death Investigation, State Medical Examiner Office (7 AAC 35.300 - 7 AAC 35.390)

**7 AAC 35.310. Investigating reported deaths.** (a) A medicolegal death investigator shall perform, for the state medical examiner, a medicolegal death investigation of each death reported under AS 12.65.005.

(b) The state medical examiner, after evaluating all available information gathered during the medicolegal death investigation, may

- (1) assume jurisdiction for the purpose of performing the remainder of the medical death investigation ~~examination~~ under AS 12.65.020;
- (2) determine whether to transport the body to the office or another location for an examination;
- (3) determine the manner and cause of death; and
- (4) determine or confirm identity. (Eff. 8/20/2020, Register 235)

**7 AAC 35.320. Assuming jurisdiction.** (a) Only the state medical examiner may assume jurisdiction after evaluating all the available information gathered during the medicolegal death investigation.

(b) The state medical examiner, after evaluating all available information gathered during the medicolegal death investigation,

- (1) will assume jurisdiction on an apparent homicide, and the department will transport the remains of the deceased person to the office or another location for examination;
- (2) will assume jurisdiction on the following, and the department may transport the remains of the deceased person to the office or another location for examination:

(A) an apparent accident;

(B) an apparent suicide;

(3) may assume jurisdiction on the following, and the department may transport the remains of the deceased person to the office or another location for examination:

(A) a stillborn infant;

(B) a death that occurred while the deceased person was in the custody of, or was being taken into the custody of, the state or a political subdivision of the state or a public officer or agent of the state or a political subdivision of the state;

(C) a death that occurred in a jail or corrections facility owned or operated by the state or a political subdivision of the state or in a facility for the placement of persons in the custody or under the supervision of the state;

(D) a death that apparently resulted from a disease that constitutes a threat to public health;

(E) a death associated with a diagnostic or therapeutic procedure;

(F) an apparently natural death that occurred suddenly when the decedent was in apparent good health;

(G) an apparently natural, unattended death; and

(4) will decline jurisdiction, except as provided in (1) and (2) of this subsection, on a case if, in the opinion of the state medical examiner, the death does not warrant further investigation. (Eff. 8/20/2020, Register 235)

**7 AAC 35.330. Transportation.** (a) If the state medical examiner or the deputy medical examiner orders transportation of the remains of the deceased person under AS 12.65.020(a)(4), the department is responsible for transportation of the remains as described in AS 12.65.025.

(b) The department will determine the mode of transportation to the applicable location under AS 12.65.025 and back to the community closest to the location of the death.

(c) Remains transported directly from the applicable location under AS 12.65.025 following examination will be shipped in a container that is appropriate for human remains and complies with the requirements in 7 AAC 35.100. (Eff. 8/20/2020, Register 235)

**7 AAC 35.340. Personal property.** (a) A medicolegal death investigator has the primary responsibility for gathering, safeguarding, and transferring personal property of the decedent.

(b) Any item present at the scene and relevant to the medical death investigation must remain at the scene and must be made available to the medicolegal death investigator to examine and photograph before the investigating agency removes it.

(c) If the remains of the deceased person need to be transported to the office or applicable location under AS 12.65.025, the personal effects on or about the remains or other item at the scene may be brought to the office if the item may be evidence.

(d) Before transporting the remains of the deceased person to the office, the medicolegal death investigator may release directly to the family of the deceased person a personal item that is not evidence.

(e) The personal property that the office releases may be picked up directly from the

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office, released to a funeral home, or shipped by the office. (Eff. 8/20/2020, Register 235 )

**7 AAC 35.350. Release of remains.** (a) The office will release the remains of a deceased person after it receives a signed *Authorization for Release of Remains* form, dated April 7, 2014, adopted by reference, completed by a person authorized under AS 13.75.020.

(b) The state medical examiner may place a hold the remains of a deceased person at a funeral home, hospital, or other site approved by the state medical examiner if the medicolegal death investigator was unable to answer some investigative questions when the investigator completed the initial death report.

(c) If the state medical examiner declines jurisdiction, and the remains of the deceased person will be released directly from the scene, the following applies:

(1) if the person died at home, and the family was present, the remains will be released directly to the family;

(2) if the person died at home, and no family was present, the remains will be released to the investigating agency;

(3) if the person died in a hospital, the remains will be released to that hospital.

**7 AAC 35.360. Viewing the remains.** The remains of a deceased person may not be viewed while in the custody of the department as part of a medicolegal death investigation or under the jurisdiction of the state medical examiner as part of a medical death ~~examination~~ <sup>investigation</sup>. (Eff.

8 / 20 / 2020, Register 235)

**7 AAC 35.390. Definitions.** In 7 AAC 35.310 - 7 AAC 35.390, unless the context requires otherwise,

- (1) "department" means the Department of Health and Social Services;
- (2) "family" means persons authorized to control disposition of a deceased person's remains under AS 13.75.020;
- (3) "jurisdiction" means responsibility for performing the remainder of a medical death ~~examination~~ <sup>investigation</sup> under AS 12.65.020, determining the manner and cause of death, and verifying the deceased person's identity;
- (4) "medicolegal death investigation" means the process at the start of a medical death ~~examination~~ <sup>investigation</sup> to assess each death reported to the department under AS 12.65.005, so that the state medical examiner may determine whether to assume jurisdiction for the purpose of performing the remainder of the medical death ~~examination~~ <sup>investigation</sup> under AS 12.65.020;

(5) "medicolegal death investigator" means a public employee or contractor in the service of the office who performs the initial death investigation; in this paragraph, "initial death investigation" includes taking reports of death, investigating scenes, collecting records, interviewing witnesses, and serving subpoenas on behalf of the state medical examiner;

(6) "office" means the state medical examiner office in the department;

(7) "personal property" means clothing and personal items;

(8) "remains" means a body or any part of a body;

(9) "unattended death" means the death of a person who has not been examined or prescribed medication by a physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse within the year before death. (Eff. 8 / 20 / 2020, Register 235 )

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Health and Social Services against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Department of Health and Social Services after the close of the public comment period. The regulations establish procedures and requirements concerning medical death investigations under AS 12.65.020 and the medicolegal death investigations that are components of those investigations.

The January 28, 2020 public notice and the July 15, 2020 adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.

The Department of Health & Social Services proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 7 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with medicolegal death investigation, including the following:

7 AAC 35. Embalming and Other Post-Mortem Services, is proposed to be changed as follows:

- Add a new article, Medicolegal Death Investigation, State Medical Examiner Office, to
  - clarify the death investigation process to include state jurisdiction;
  - clarify who can claim a decedent and decedent's property;
  - clarify procedure to view a decedent; and
  - define terminology.

You may comment on the proposed regulation changes, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed changes, by submitting written comments to Mr. Stephen J.
