The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulation of the Division of Corporations, Business, and Professional Licensing against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Division of Corporations, Business, and Professional Licensing after the close of the public comment period. No comments were received. The regulation modifications concern lessening the fees for initial permits and licenses for funeral directors, embalmers, and funeral establishments, as well as biannual renewal fees for the same. The department requests that these regulations be filed in order to be effective by the first week of September, 2020- H for the upcoming license renewals in December, 2020.

The June 19, 2020 public notice and the July 24, 2020 adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.
