The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. I have reviewed this project under a delegation of authority dated March 23, 2020 from the Regulations Attorney. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers after the close of the public comment period. Reflecting amendments to AS 08.13 enacted under ch. 23, SLA 2018, the regulations update health and sanitation requirements in shops and schools.

The March 6, 2020 public notice and the May 19, 2020 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.
