The Department of Law has reviewed, against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act, the attached emergency regulations that the State Medical Board intends to make permanent with further amendments. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. I have reviewed this project under a delegation of authority dated March 23, 2020 from the regulations attorney.

As explained in this memorandum, the emergency regulations were adopted on April 30, 2020, and were filed and took effect on May 5, 2020; the emergency regulations were readopted with a small amendment on May 11, 2020, were filed on May 12, 2020, and had the same May 5, 2020 effective date. All of the emergency regulations will expire on September 1, 2020 unless made permanent.

This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the State Medical Board after the close of the public comment period. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the regulations relax telemedicine requirements to allow a physician or physician assistant to examine, diagnose, and treat a patient for an opioid use disorder without a healthcare provider present with the patient, during a disaster emergency declared by the governor.

The May 1, 2020 certification of adoption order for the emergency regulations, the May 11, 2020 certification of adoption order for the emergency regulations, the May 10, 2020 public notice, the May 14, 2020 supplemental public notice, the July 27, 2020 certification of compliance, and the July 27, 2020 certification of adoption order all state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

The State Medical Board originally adopted 12 AAC 40.943(b) by emergency action on April 30, 2020. Those regulations were filed and took effect May 5, 2020, with an expiration date of September 1, 2020 under AS 44.62.260. Owing in part to confusion about whether

AS 44.62.260 or a governor's disaster declaration under AS 26.23.020 set the duration of the emergency regulations, the State Medical Board proposed a minor amendment to add "or oral" after "urine" in 12 AAC 40.943(b)(3) to the emergency regulations.

On May 7, 2020, the board adopted that change with the rest of 12 AAC 40.943(b) as a single set of emergency regulations, and issued a supplemental public notice under AS 44.62.190 stating that the board intended to make the emergency regulations permanent. So that all the emergency regulations would have a single effective date, and thus a single expiration date if not made permanent, the regulations attorney requested that the lieutenant governor's office file the regulations with the original May 5, 2020 effective date. To bump the effective date beyond the original effective date would raise questions as to whether the State Medical Board's emergency regulations were in compliance with AS 44.62.260. On the other hand, to allow the two-word amendment to survive beyond the expiration date of the rest of the regulations would lead to a useless result.

After the existing editor's note for 12 AAC 40.943 we have inserted a new paragraph to explain the effective date and expiration date of the emergency regulations. We have also made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The editor's note text and corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.

The Chair stated that the board reviewed the public comments relating to proposed changes to 12 AAC 40.943 at their July 9th meeting and determined the comments warranted a separate, more in-depth discussion at a future meeting.

Additionally, the board determined there is no additional cost to the public for the proposed regulations.

On a motion duly made by Dr. Daugherty, seconded by Dr. Freeman, and approved by the majority, the Board revised the proposed changes, new subsection (b) of 12 AAC 40.943 Standards of Practice for Telemedicine by implementing the following amendments:

Strike "Declared by the Governor of this state under AS 26.23.020" and replace with "During a disaster emergency"

Dr. Daugherty, Dr. Freeman, Dr. Gay, Ms. Mielke, and Dr. Wein vote "Yes", Mr. Boswell voted "No". Motion carried.

FINDING OF EMERGENCY

The State Medical Board finds that an emergency exists and that the attached regulation changes are necessary to 12 AAC 40.943, dealing with telemedicine, for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, or general welfare. The facts constituting the emergency include the following:

The recent regulation allowing the initiation of medication assisted treatment via telemedicine was found too restrictive and an amendment was necessary to avoid a negative health impact on the public by decreasing access to and engagement with treatment during this public health emergency caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Chapter 40. State Medical Board.

12 AAC 40.943 is amended to read:

12 AAC 40.943. Standard of practice for telemedicine. (a) The guiding principles for telemedicine practice in the American Medical Association (AMA), Report 7 of the Council on Medical Service (A-14), Coverage of and Payment for Telemedicine, dated 2014, and the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB), Model Policy for the Appropriate Use of Telemedicine Technologies in the Practice of Medicine, dated April 2014, are adopted by reference as the standards of practice when providing treatment, rendering a diagnosis, prescribing, dispensing, or administering a prescription or controlled substance without first conducting an in-person physical examination under AS 08.64.364.

(b) During a public health emergency disaster declared by the governor of this state under AS 26.23.020, an appropriate licensed health care provider need not be present with the patient to assist a physician or physician assistant with examination, diagnosis, and treatment if the physician or physician-assistant is prescribing, dispensing, or administering buprenorphine to initiate treatment for opioid use disorder and the physician or physician assistant

(1) is a Drug Addiction Treatment Act (DATA) waived practitioner;

(2) documents all attempts to conduct a physical examination under AS

08.64.364(b) and the reason why the examination cannot be performed; and

(3) requires urine or oral toxicology screening as part of the patient's medication adherence plan. (Eff. 10/8/2017, Register 224; am 5 /5 / 2020, Register 234)
