The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Board of Dental Examiners against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Board of Dental Examiners after the close of the public comment period. In part to address the COVID-19 pandemic, the regulations concern the suspension of patient-based periodontics testing as part of examinations for applicants, the use of mannequins as part of examinations for applicants, other aspects of examinations for applicants, registration with the prescription drug management program (PDMP) controlled substance prescription database, and the administration of opioids to patients.

The May 19, 2020 public notice and the August 7, 2020 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.
