The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Big Game Commercial Services Board against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Big Game Commercial Services Board after the close of the public comment period. The regulations add requirements for jurisprudence examinations for knowledge of AS 08.54 and 12 AAC 75, set up procedures for a registered or master guide-outfitter, unable in the spring 2020 season to hunt brown bear in game management unit 9, to register for the hunt for the spring 2021 season, and clarify reporting requirements for a contracted transportation service.

The Big Game Commercial Services Board split this project into two parts, to address separately a section of proposed regulations and invite additional public comment on that section.

The August 13, 2020 public notice and the October 2, 2020 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.

46	Ms. Hoffard informed the board that per their request, a review of the board's authority to regulate
47	buffer areas had been submitted to the Department of Law. AAG Megyn Wiegand had responded that
48	the board does not have the authority to enact such regulation. A regulation of this type would
49	effectively give a property right – the right to exclude, to individuals that own cabins built before a

certain date. The proposals are not of uniform, universal, application but instead seems to benefit a narrow class of individuals to the commercial detriment of other market participants. The Board would need clear statutory authority showing a legislative intent to limit competition before adopting such a regulation. AS 08.54.720(a)(2) and 12 AAC 75.340(d)(8) give the Board authority to intervene when a crowded field leads to conflict between licensees. The Board cannot manage land in the way proposed in the regulation request. Ms. Hoffard will send a letter to the individuals that have submitted the buffer area proposals. She will also keep a record of that letter for staff to send if/when similar proposals are submitted in the future.

Ms. Heun explained that the original proposal was made in an effort to hold transporters accountable in a manner consistent with registered and master guides as hunt records are required to be submitted within 60 days. Ms. Hoffard explained that she has responded to questions from the industry struggling to determine when they should submit the annual report and what that report should consist of. After discussion it was decided that 75-days is an acceptable timeframe and would not cause undue burden on transporters or the administrative staff.

Chair Tiffany asked the board to consider the option of holding the November 30 – December 2 board meeting via Zoom. Some board members may spend time out of the state and it is not feasible for them to quarantine in Anchorage for 14 days before a 3-day board meeting. The intention is for Ms. Hoffard and Mr. Bay to carry out their regular duties for the meeting and exam without creating a burden to Anchorage administrative staff.
