FINDING OF EMERGENCY

The Board of Nursing finds that an emergency exists under AS 44.62.250 requiring an immediate expansion of courtesy licenses, and that an emergency regulation change is necessary to 12 AAC 44.318, dealing with emergency courtesy license, for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, or general welfare. The facts constituting the emergency include the following:

Facilities are unable to maintain staffing levels due to the current and ongoing spike in COVID-19 hospitalizations and the increase in nursing staff unable to report to work due to COVID-positive tests, quarantine awaiting test results, or caring for a COVID-positive relative—especially in rural areas and in facilities serving special needs populations. The commissioner of the Department of Health and Social Services has specifically requested health care boards implement emergency measures to allow qualified providers in other jurisdictions to become licensed quickly in Alaska to fill these gaps.

ORDER CERTIFYING ADOPTION

I certify that the Board of Nursing, under the authority of AS 08.01.062, AS 08.68.100, AS 08.68.170, AS 08.68.270, and AS 08.68.275, adopted at its November 4, 2020 teleconference meeting the attached two pages of regulation changes as an emergency regulation to take effect immediately upon filing by the lieutenant governor, as provided in AS 44.62.180(3).

Chapter 44. Board of Nursing.

12 AAC 44.318 is repealed and readopted to read:

12 AAC 44.318. Emergency courtesy license. (a) In an urgent situation, the board will issue an emergency courtesy license to practice nursing to an applicant who meets the requirements of this section. The board may restrict the license to only those nursing services required to respond to the urgent situation. The licensee may not practice nursing outside the scope of the limited purpose for which the emergency courtesy license is issued.

- (b) An applicant for an emergency courtesy license under this section must submit to the department a completed application on a form provided by the department. A complete application includes the applicable application and licensing fees established in 12 AAC 02.280
- (c) An emergency courtesy license issued under this section is valid for the period specified by the board and may not exceed 120 consecutive days. An emergency courtesy license may be renewed for one additional period specified by the board, not to exceed 120 consecutive days, and provided the additional period expires within 18 months of the date the license is first issued.
- (d) The board will not issue, and an emergency courtesy license holder may not use, an emergency courtesy license as a substitute for a temporary license or other license required under AS 08.68.
- (e) While practicing under an emergency courtesy license issued under this section, the holder of the emergency courtesy license must comply with the standards of practice set out in AS 08.68 and this chapter.

- (f) The board may refuse to issue an emergency courtesy license for the same reasons that it may deny, suspend, or revoke a license under AS 08.68.270.
- (g) In this section, "urgent situation" means a health crisis requiring an increased availability of nurses or nurses with specialized education. (Eff. 11/19/2008, Register 188; am 5/16/2018, Register 226; em am 4/10/2020 8/7/2020, Register 234; am 11/10/2020, Register 234; am 236)
