

Curbside Pickup and Home Delivery FAQ

<p>When does the allowance of curbside pickup and home delivery end?</p> <p>What does “permanent” mean?</p> <p>Would these emergency regulations be permanent after COVID-19?</p> <p>Why are you making them permanent?</p>	<p>We understand this can be confusing. When the board passed its emergency regulations, it permitted curbside and home delivery to extend through the earlier of the end of the Governor’s suspension order or 120 days, the length of time emergency regulations can be effective. That 120 day deadline is March 16, 2021. If the public health emergency extends beyond March 16, 2021, the board would need permanent regulations to permit curbside and home delivery beyond that date. While those regulations are “permanent,” curbside and home delivery is not because a sunset date is built into the regulations. That is, once the public health emergency and the suspension of Title 4 alcoholic beverage licensing law ends, curbside pickup and home delivery ends. For now, know that curbside and home delivery is permitted through December 15, 2020. What happens after that date will be dependent on the action of the Governor or Legislature.</p>
