The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Labor and Workforce Development and the Alaska Workers' Compensation Board against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems that would prevent the filing of these regulations. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations concern annual updates to medical fee schedules. Under AS 23.30.035(h) and 23.30.005(l), the department and the board are required to make annual updates to medical fee schedules adopted by the board in regulation. The department requests that these be filed in time to be in effect by January 1, 2021.

The regulations were adopted more than 30 days after the initial public notice, and the public was given an opportunity to provide written comments and an opportunity to provide oral comments at its October 1 and 2, 2020 meeting.

The public notice and the adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.
