7 AAC 86.010. Reporting the price of health care services. (a) A health care provider or health care facility that uses the American Medical Association's *Current Procedural Terminology (CPT)* codes in its normal course of business must annually compile a list and report to the department the health care services most commonly performed as required under AS 18.23.400.

(b) A health care provider or health care facility must submit by electronic mail to the department the Internet address of the website containing its health care services price posting.

(c) A health care provider or health care facility that does not have an Internet website must submit a text version of the posting to the department by electronic mail. The text version must be sent in one of the following formats: portable document format (PDF), word processing (DOC, DOCX, ODT), presentation (PPT, PPTX, ODP), spreadsheet (XLS, XLSX, ODS), e-book (EPUB), text (TXT, CSV), or rich text format (RTF).

(d) The health care provider or health care facility must title the electronic mail and the

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attachment with the following convention: [Provider Name]\_[Provider

address]\_[Year].[Format]. The title may only contain the special characters of underscore, hyphen, and space. The titles may not include apostrophes, double quotes, or special characters. For example, an electronic mail and PDF heading for a hospital in Juneau would be formatted as "Hospital Name\_3620 Hospital Drive Juneau\_2019.PDF" . (Eff. <u>12/20/2020</u>, Register <u>236</u>) **Authority:** AS 18.05.040 AS 18.23.400

7 AAC 86.020. Posting the price for health care services. (a) A health care provider or health care facility that uses the *Current Procedural Terminology (CPT)* codes in its normal course of business must post, as required under AS 18.23.400, the price list for the health care services most commonly performed.

(b) When providing or posting price lists as required under AS 18.23.400(e)(1) and (2), the health care provider or health facility must include the American Medical Association's copyright notice and disclaimer, using the following language: "CPT® Copyright 2020 [or insert applicable year]. American Medical Association. All rights reserved. CPT is a registered trademark of the American Medical Association. The CPT codes are provided "as is" without warranty of any kind. The AMA specifically disclaims all liability for use or accuracy of any CPT codes."

(c) A health care provider or health care facility must

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(1) post the applicable health care services price list in a conspicuous space where a patient checks in and waits to see a health care provider;

(2) post the required price information on or before January 31 following the calendar year for which the health care price data was collected; and

(3) update the posting every year.

(d) A health care provider or health care facility may post the applicable health care services price list printed on paper or an electronic screen in a font not smaller than 20 points.

(e) A satellite office of a health care provider or health care facility that has a space where patients may check in and wait must also post the price for any applicable health care services. (Eff.  $\frac{|2/20}{2000}$ , Register 230)

**7 AAC 86.030. Good faith estimate.** (a) A health care provider or health care facility that receives a request under (b) or (c) of this section must provide a good faith estimate under AS 18.23.400(g) and (h), regardless of whether the health care provider or health care facility uses CPT codes.

(b) To get a good faith estimate, a patient must provide the following information in writing to the health care provider or health care facility:

(1) the patient's full name;

(2) the medical condition or service for which the patient is seeking medical treatment;

(3) the method by which the patient prefers to receive the estimate, including in a

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written letter mailed to the patient, by electronic means, or orally; and

(4) the patient's contact information, including the patient's mailing address, electronic mail address, or telephone number.

(c) To get a good faith estimate, a parent or guardian of a minor patient must provide the following information in writing to the health care provider or health care facility:

(1) the patient's full name;

(2) the medical condition or service for which the patient is seeking medical treatment;

(3) the method by which the parent or guardian prefers to receive the estimate,

including in a written letter mailed to the parent or guardian, by electronic means, or orally; and

(4) the parent or guardian's contact information, including the parent or guardian's mailing address, electronic mail address, or telephone number. (Eff. <u>17/20/2020</u>, Register 234)

7 AAC 86.040. Enforcement. (a) If the department receives a report that a health care provider or health care facility has failed to comply with AS 18.23.400 or this chapter, the department may investigate the matter. If the department determines that a health care provider or health care facility failed to comply, the department may contact the health care provider or health care facility by telephone to inform the provider or facility of the requirements of AS 18.23.400 and this chapter.

(b) If the health care provider or health care facility fails to remedy noncompliance after

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being contacted under (a) of this section, the department may contact the health care provider or health care facility in writing, identifying how the health care provider or health care facility has failed to meet the requirements of AS 18.23.400 and this chapter.

(c) If the health care provider or health care facility fails to comply after being contacted under (b) of this section, the department may issue a warning in writing to the health care provider or health care facility.

(d) If the health care provider or health care facility fails to comply after receiving a warning under (c) of this section, the department may assess a fine under AS 18.23.400(k).

(e) The fine for a violation of AS 18.23.400 and this chapter is \$100 for each day of noncompliance, up to the \$10,000 ceiling set under AS 18.23.400(k). (Eff. 12 //2020, Register 236)

**7 AAC 86.090. Definitions.** (a) In AS 18.23.400, "plain language" means grammatically correct language that includes accurate word usage and communicates in a way that helps the public to easily understand the information.

(b) As used in the definition of "health care service" in AS 18.23.400(n), "telemedicine" means the practice of health care delivery, evaluation, diagnosis, consultation, or treatment, using the transfer of medical data through audio, video, or data communications that are engaged in over two or more locations between providers who are physically separated from the patient or from each other. (Eff. 12/12/1000, Register  $23\omega$ )

Re: Department Health and Social Services regulations re: health care services price transparency (7 AAC 86)

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Health and Social Services against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Department of Health and Social Services after the close of the public comment period.

The regulations implement, interpret, and make specific AS 18.23.400 (disclosure and reporting of health care services, price, and fee information), added by sec. 4, ch. 75, SLA 2018 (HCS CSSB 105(FIN) am H). Under AS 18.23.400(a) and (b), a health care provider or health care facility has to use codes from the American Medical Association's *Current Procedural Terminology* (CPT) to disclose prices for its most common services. The statute also sets out requirements, in AS 18.23.400(g) and (h), for the provider or facility to give, on a patient's request, a good faith estimate of the reasonably anticipated charges for nonemergency services; AS 18.23.400(g) and (h) do not include a requirement that the provider or facility use CPT codes in the estimate.

The distinction regarding CPT codes is significant: though AS 18.23.400(n) sets out broad definitions for "health care facility" and "health care provider," some professionals – for example, dentists – do not use CPT codes. Working from the language of AS 18.23.400, 7 AAC 86.010 and 7 AAC 86.020 require price disclosure for common services only from a provider or facility that uses CPT codes; 7 AAC 86.030 requires a good faith estimate from any provider or facility, regardless of whether the provider or facility uses CPT codes. This reading of AS 18.23.400 ensures that a provider or facility that does not use CPT codes has only the duties that it can fulfill (good faith estimates).

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We also note that the open ended definition in AS 18.23.400(n) for "health care provider" does not identify the entities included in the statute's reach, but the lack of specificity is not something that the agency can resolve. While developing 7 AAC 86.030, the Department of Health and Social Services considered a section-specific definition of "health care provider," modeled in part on the definition of "health care practitioner" in a Municipality of Anchorage ordinance that, like AS 18.23.400(g) and (h), requires good faith estimates for nonemergency health care services. *See* Anchorage Municipal Code (AMC) ch. 16.130. That definition includes a list of health care practitioners regulated under AS 08. *See* AMC ch. 16.130.900. But using the municipality's list is unworkable for a state administrative agency.

First, by enacting ordinances the Anchorage Assembly and the mayor act as the legislature and the chief executive for a municipality, rather than as an administrative agency that implements, interprets, or carries out legislation. Accordingly, the municipality was free to craft a definition of "health care practitioner" as the municipality saw fit. By contrast, if the Department of Health and Social Services set out a similar definition of "health care provider," a question would arise regarding the agency's authority to exclude, for example, direct-entry midwives under AS 08.65, and whether the agency was making arbitrary distinctions.

Second, 7 AAC 86.030 could not include a definition of "health care provider" that was specific to that section and that departed from the statutory definition already set out in AS 18.23.400(n). Though the regulatory definition might offer specificity, based on what appears in AMC ch. 16.130.900, a one-to-one correspondence between the municipal ordinance and AS 18.23.400 does not work, because AMC ch. 16.130 uses the umbrella term "health care practitioner," and only that term. By contrast, any definition in 7 AAC 86.030 for "health care provider", as used in AS 18.23.400, could risk covering professions within the different statutory definition of "health care facility": for example, the "office of a private physician or dentist *whether in individual or group practice.*" AS 18.23.400(n) (defining "health care facility"). [Emphasis added.]

We have a final observation that does not bear directly on these regulations. While AS 18.23.400 requires only health care facilities and health care providers to post prices, the statute requires good faith estimates not only from health care facilities and health care providers but also from health care *insurers* within the meaning of AS 21.54.500. *See* AS 18.23.400(g), (h), and (n). We highly doubt that the legislature meant AS 18.23.400 as an invitation for the Department of Health and Social Services to regulate private insurers. Section 5, ch. 75, SLA 2018 (SB 105) adds AS 21.96.200 to the Insurance Code: a complementary provision requiring insurers to provide good faith estimates under AS 18.23.400(g). As part of the Insurance Code (AS 21), AS 21.96.200 would fall under the regulatory authority of the Division of Insurance.
