## NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES ON APPEAL PROCESS RELATED TO PARTICIPATION IN THE NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR STATE AUTHORIZATION RECIPROCITY AGREEMENTS (NC-SARA) PROGRAM IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA COMMISSION ON POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION

## **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

The Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education proposes to change regulations on the appeal process related to participation in the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA) program.

The Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education (ACPE) proposes to adopt regulations changes in Title 20, Chapter 17 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with hearing and resolving appeals from institutions that may be denied participation in the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA) program, including the following:

- (1) 20 AAC 17.018(a), Denial of exemption. The proposed change would set out an appeal process if the Commission denies an application for participation in NC-SARA.
- (2) 20 AAC 17.018(b), Denial of exemption. The proposed change would clarify the process for requesting a hearing in response to an appeal decision.
- (3) 20 AAC 17.018, Denial of exemption. Adding subsection (c) is proposed to make explicit the appellant's status as a participant or non-participant pending any appeal process decision.
