The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board after the close of the public comment period. The regulations amend the requirements regarding the repackaging by licensed package stores of beer from kegs into other containers, for sale on the licensed premises and consumption off those premises, to allow repackaging from kegs of cider as well.

The August 25, 2020 public notice and the November 2, 2020 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.
