

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the State Board of Education and Early Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the State Board of Education and Early Development after the close of the public comment period. The regulations adopt by reference updated library and information literacy standards.

We have provided a photocopy of the publisher's affidavit for the September 6, 2020 supplemental public notice. The original of the publisher's affidavit was filed with the State Board of Education and Early Development's emergency regulations made permanent regarding Internet speed (Department of Law file number 2020200429).

The July 26, 2020 public notice, the September 6, 2020 supplemental public notice, and the September 24, 2020 certification of adoption order all state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.

UPDATE LIBRARY STANDARDS IN THE REGULATIONS OF  
THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND EARLY DEVELOPMENT

**BRIEF DESCRIPTION:** The proposed amendments would adopt updated standards for library and information literacy.

The Department of Education and Early Development proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 4 of the Alaska Administrative Code dealing with library and information literacy standards. The current Library/Information Literacy Standards have not been updated since 1999. The proposed library and information literacy standards are adopted by reference in 4 AAC 04.170 as *Alaska School Library Framework for Learners, 2020 Edition*, based on standards developed by the American Association of School Librarians.

The Department of Education and Early Development invites the public to submit written comments during the written comment period, which begins with the date of this notice and ends on Tuesday, August 25, 2020, at 4:30 p.m. The written comment period closes in advance of the meeting of the State Board of Education and Early Development at which the board will consider the adoption of the proposed regulations. This allows the Department of Education and Early Development an opportunity to prepare changes based on written comment and to distribute any proposed changes to the board for its consideration prior to the meeting.

You may comment in writing on the proposed regulation changes, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed changes, by submitting written comments to the Commissioner's Office, Department of Education and Early Development, Attn: Regulations Review, 801 West Tenth Street, Suite 200, PO Box 110500, Juneau, Alaska 99811-0500. This is a SUPPLEMENTAL NOTICE providing the call-in information needed for the public to provide oral comment regarding the six proposed regulation changes listed below at the meeting of the State Board of Education and Early Development on September 16, 2020. Because of a planned change in the online platform for the meeting, the call-in information was not available at the time of the earlier public notices.

For proposed changes numbered 1-5, below, this information is supplemental to the NOTICES OF PROPOSED CHANGES issued on July 21, 2020. For proposed changes numbered 6, below, this information is supplemental to the NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES issued on June 23, 2020. 1. Proposed changes to update the energy efficiency code for schools - the proposed amendment would adopt updated energy efficiency standards for school construction and renovation.
2. Proposed changes to update library standards - the proposed amendments would adopt updated standards for library and information literacy.
3. Proposed changes on high school credit for Army National Guard military training - the proposed regulation would require school districts to award high school credit to eligible students who have completed Alaska Army National Guard military training.
4. Proposed changes to fees of the Division of Libraries, Archives, and Museums - the proposed amendments would update fees charged by the Division of Libraries, Archives, and Museums.
5. Proposed changes to temporary emergency certificates - the proposed amendments would repeal the current authority for an emergency special services certificate and would provide authority for the issuance of an emergency initial teaching certificate and an emergency administrative certificate if a district is unable to locate a qualified applicant.
6. Proposed changes to make emergency Internet upgrade regulations permanent: Emergency regulations regarding increased Internet access for schools are proposed to become permanent.
