State Medical Board regulations re: registration of physicians and physician assistants with the prescription drug monitoring program (PDMP) controlled substance prescription database (12 AAC 40.450(a); 12 AAC 40.976)

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the State Medical Board against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the State Medical Board after the close of the public comment period. The regulations establish requirements for physicians and physician assistants to register with the prescription drug monitoring program (PDMP) controlled substance prescription database, as established by the Board of Pharmacy and required under AS 17.30.200; and to comply with AS 17.30.200 and with regulations of the Board of Pharmacy under 12 AAC 52.865 (reporting and reviewing PDMP information).

The August 6, 2020 public notice and the December 4, 2020 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.
