The Department of Law has reviewed, against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act, the attached emergency regulations that the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development intends to make permanent. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. The emergency regulations were adopted, were filed, and took effect on November 30, 2020. They will expire on March 29, 2021 unless made permanent.

This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The emergency regulations were approved by the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development, after the close of the public comment period, as permanent regulations. Reflecting recent emergency regulations from a number of professional licensing boards to provide for emergency courtesy licenses--in part to address the COVID-19 pandemic, and in part to address future disasters or urgent situations--the emergency regulations from the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development establish fees for the new licenses.

The November 30, 2020 emergency adoption order, the December 2, 2020 public notice and the January 15, 2021 certification of compliance all state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.
