The Department of Law has reviewed, against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act, the attached emergency regulations that the State Medical Board intends to make permanent with a further amendment. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. The emergency regulations were adopted on November 20, 2020, and were filed and took effect on December 8, 2020. The State Medical Board action to make the regulations permanent and to make the permanent amendment occurred on January 29, 2021 (which was after the state legislature convened). The emergency regulations will expire on April 6, 2021 unless made permanent.

This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The emergency regulations were approved by the State Medical Board, after the close of the public comment period, as permanent regulations with further permanent amendments. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic and future urgent situations, the regulations allow a physician and physician assistant in a collaborative practice to satisfy requirements for direct personal contact by using audio and video means.

The December 7, 2020 certification of emergency adoption order, the December 10, 2020 public notice, the February 2, 2021 certification of compliance, and the February 2, 2021 certification of adoption order for the permanent regulations all state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.
