Who is asking for this change?	The board has been receiving, for some time, requests from the public at large to increase the THC serving limit in edibles.
If this regulation change passes, how long is it going to take for it to become effective?	The change would become effective 30 days from when the Lt. Governor signs the change. The time from when the board adopts the change in regulation to when the Lt. Governor signs it depends on variables.
	Changes to serving sizes on current and any new products would need to be approved by the board.
How would this change benefit Alaska's marijuana industry?	The marijuana industry contends the increases in THC content reflect what is happening on a national level. As such, the industry could stay current with consumer demand.
Has AMCO identified any potential risks or consequences related to increasing the THC limits in edibles?	AMCO has reached out to the Department of Health and Social Services for their health and public safety concerns regarding the increase. AMCO can report on those comments when they are available.
