In accordance with the authority of the regulations attorney under AS 44.62.125(b), please forward to the publisher the corrections to the Alaska Administrative Code (AAC) described below. I have forwarded these corrections under a specific delegation dated March 23, 2020 from the regulations attorney. These revisions are conforming changes to reflect the rearrangement of statutory subsections by the revisor of statutes under AS 01.05.031.

The regulations to be revised are 12 AAC 52.865(a), (b), and (f). The revisions to those subsections are as follows:

--At all appearances, change "AS 17.30.200(u)" to "AS 17.30.200(t)"

In addition, in the editor's note following 12 AAC 52.865, please add a new paragraph at the end to read as follows:

In 2019 the revisor of statutes, acting under AS 01.05.031, rearranged the subsections in AS 17.30.200. As a result, the subsection formerly designated as AS 17.30.200(u) is now designated as AS 17.30.200(t). As of Register 237 (April 2020), the regulations attorney made conforming technical revisions under AS 44.62.125(b)(6), to 12 AAC 52.865, so that cross-references now cite AS 17.30.200(t), formerly designated AS 17.30.200(u).
