- (e) The board may refuse to issue an emergency courtesy license for the same reasons that it may deny, suspend, or revoke a license under AS 08.29.400.
- (f) In this section, "urgent situation" means a health crisis affecting all or part of the state that requires increased availability of professional counselors. (Eff. 11/20/2020, Register 236)

The Department of Law has reviewed, against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act, the attached emergency regulations that the Board of Professional Counselors intends to make permanent. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. The emergency regulations were adopted on November 5, 2020, and were filed and took effect on November 20, 2020. The Board of Professional Counselors action to make the regulations permanent occurred on February 18, 2021, after the state legislative session began. The emergency regulations will expire on March 19, 2021 unless made permanent.

This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The emergency regulations were approved by the Board of Professional Counselors, after the close of the public comment period, as permanent regulations. To increase the availability of professional counseling services during the COVID-19 pandemic and future health crises, the regulations provide for emergency courtesy licenses in urgent situations.

The November 16, 2020 certification of adoption order, the November 27, 2020 public notice, and the February 18, 2021 certification of compliance all state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

In accordance with AS 44.62.125, we have made a technical correction to renumber the regulation from "12 AAC 62.450," originally part of Article 4 (distance professional services), to the logical number 12 AAC 62.150, in Article 1 (licensing requirements). The correction is shown on the attached copy of the regulations.
