The Department of Law has reviewed, against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act, the attached emergency regulations that the Board of Psychologist and Psychological Associate Examiners intends to make permanent. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. The emergency regulations were adopted on November 5, 2020, and were filed and took effect on November 20, 2020. The Board of Psychologist and Psychological Associate Examiners action to make the regulations permanent occurred on March 11, 2021, after the state legislative session began. The emergency regulations will expire on March 19, 2021 unless made permanent.

This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The emergency regulations were approved by the Board of Psychologist and Psychological Associate Examiners, after the close of the public comment period, as permanent regulations. To increase the availability of psychology services during the COVID-19 pandemic and future health crises, the regulations provide for emergency courtesy licenses in urgent situations.

The November 16, 2020 certification of adoption order, the November 28, 2020 public notice, and the March 11, 2021 certification of compliance all state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

- Anticipated challenges in availability and delivery of vaccine
