

**NOTICE OF RIGHT-OF-WAY AMENDMENT APPLICATION  
TRANS-ALASKA PIPELINE SYSTEM, ADL 63574  
SPUR DIKE NO. 1 EXTENSION AT SAGAVANIRKTOK RIVER**

The Alaska Department of Natural Resources (DNR), pursuant to Alaska Statute (AS) 38.35.070, hereby gives notice that Alyeska Pipeline Service Company (APSC) submitted a request to amend the Trans-Alaska Pipeline System (TAPS) Right-of-Way (ROW) Lease, ADL 63574, to add lands approximately 22.5 miles south of Pump Station 1 in Deadhorse, Alaska.

This project is a continuation of efforts by APSC to protect TAPS from current and future flood events and ongoing erosion along the Sagavanirktok River through upgrades to the spur dike system in the area. This project will extend Spur Dike 1 for approximately 350 feet west to key-in the structure at a higher elevation to prevent it from being outflanked by the Sagavanirktok River. In addition, a fail-safe enhancement will be added to the existing dike on the TAPS workpad. Other activities including restoring the rock apron and slope stabilization between Spur Dike 1 and Spur Dike 2, will be located within the existing ROW, although the construction area will extend outside the ROW and is being adjudicated under a separate land use permit application.

The proposed construction ROW is near TAPS Pipeline Milepost 22.5 and is approximately 355 feet long by 170 feet wide, containing approximately 1.4 acres. The project is located within Township 7 North, Range 14 East, Umiat Meridian.

AS 38.35.200 governs judicial review of decisions of the Commissioner:

*38.35.200. Judicial review of decisions of commissioner on application.*

*(a) An applicant or competing applicant or a person who has direct financial interest affected by the lease who raises objections within 60 days of the publication of notice under AS 38.35.070 are the only persons with standing to seek judicial review of a decision of the commissioner under AS 38.35.100.*

*(b) The only grounds for judicial review of a decision of the commissioner are*

*(1) failure to follow the procedures set out in this chapter; or*

*(2) abuse of discretion so capricious, arbitrary, or confiscatory as to constitute a denial of due process.*

Any objections pursuant to AS 38.35.200, must be submitted in writing to the address below by 5:00 p.m. on May 28, 2021.
