The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Health and Social Services against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. With the approval of the State Medical Board under AS 13.52.065(b), the regulations were adopted by the Department of Health and Social Services after the close of the public comment period. The regulations update the do-not-resuscitate (DNR) protocol for physicians and other health care providers to withhold cardiopulmonary resuscitation under AS 13.52.065, including adoption by reference of the department's Physician Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment (POLST) Program.
