The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development after the close of the public comment period.

The regulations establish new occupational licensing biennial registration renewal fees for massage therapy establishments and fees for changes of location. We have previously approved regulations setting fees for the registration and investigation of massage therapy establishments, reflecting amendments to AS 08.61.020(2) that took effect July 1, 2019, to require the Board of Massage Therapists to adopt regulations governing massage therapy establishments. Secs. 2 and 7, ch. 10, SLA 2018.

The older regulations and these regulations fall in part under the authority of AS 08.61.090, allowing the establishment of "fees under AS 08.01.065 for application, license issuance, license renewal, and investigation under this chapter." The legislature has not amended AS 08.61.090 since 2014, when the legislature first regulated massage therapy. The 2018 amendments did not include a conforming change to AS 08.61.090, but the legislature would not have amended AS 08.61.020(2) without expecting "that the total amount of fees collected for an occupation approximately [equal] the actual regulatory costs for the occupation." AS 08.01.065(c). Because the umbrella provisions of AS 08.01.065(a) require the establishment

of "all other fees as appropriate for the occupations covered by this chapter," fees pertaining to massage therapy establishments are required under AS 08.01.065(a) and (c) and AS 08.61.090,

In accordance with AS 44.62.125, we have made a single edit to the authority citation for 12 AAC 02.396, adding a citation to AS 08.61.020. The edit is shown on the attached copy of the regulations.

The February 9, 2021 public notice and the April 2, 2021 adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.
