On April 13, 2021, the Department of Law reviewed regulations of the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities in project transmittal 2020200733 against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we found no legal problems, and authorized your office to file the regulations.

This memorandum supplements our first memorandum of April 13, 2021, to accurately describe and summarize the delays in rents and permit fees for the Deadhorse airport: At the Deadhorse airport, the current fees, until December 31, 2021, are frozen at 2019 rates. *See* 17 AAC 45.127(c)(2). Fee increases originally scheduled for 2020 are postponed until January 1, 2022: two years behind the original schedule. *See* 17 AAC 45.127(c)(3). Similarly, fee increases originally scheduled for 2021 are postponed until January 1, 2023. *See* 17 AAC 45.127(c)(4). Finally, the increases for 2022 are postponed until January 1, 2024. *See* 17 AAC 45.127(c)(5).
