The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development after the close of the public comment period. Under AS 08.18, the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development directly regulates professions within the umbrella of construction contractors. The regulations concern licensing of, and bonding requirements for, professions regulated as construction contractors, and include provisions regarding handyman contractors, updated continuing competency requirements, and the removal of outdated language.

The March 21, 2021 public notice and the July 1, 2021 adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES TO CONTRACTOR LICENSING IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, COMMUNITY, AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: The Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development proposes changes to the regulations for licensing, bonding requirements, and clarification of outdated language.

The Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development (Department) proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 12, Chapter 21 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with contractor licensing, including the following:

- 12 AAC 21.010. Joint venture agreement, is proposed to be repealed.
- 12 AAC 21.020. Application for registration as a construction contractor, is proposed to be repealed and readopted to replace outdated wording with current application requirements.
- **12 AAC 21.040. Change of name and address,** is proposed to be amended to add business name for clarification purposes, and remove the duplicate license fee.
- 12 AAC 21.043. Dissolution or cessation of business activities, changes are a proposed new subsection to outline the requirements for reactivation of a business that had previously ceased to do business.
- **12 AAC 21.045. Changing sole proprietorships and partnerships**, is proposed to be amended to clarify the wording for documenting workers' compensation insurance.
- 12 AAC 21.050. Changing sole proprietorship or partnership to a corporation or other entity, is proposed to be amended by updating the types of business entities and adding a new subsection allowing for one business to apply for a contractor license.
- **12 AAC 21.070. Renewal; lapsed registration,** is proposed to be repealed and readopted to outline the requirements for reinstating a lapsed license.
- 12 AAC 21.075. Changing handyman, specialty, or mechanical contractor registration, is a proposed new section that outlines the requirements for changing the category or specialty of a current contractor registration.
- 12 AAC 21.080. Changing from handyman, specialty, or mechanical contractor, to general contractor, is proposed to be amended to add the category of handyman for the requirements to change to a general contractor registration, and to amend the required documentation for workers' compensation insurance to be consistent with the statutory language.
- 12 AAC 21.085. Changing from general contractor to handyman, specialty, or mechanical contractor, is proposed to be amended to add the category of handyman for the requirements to change from a general contractor registration to another category, and to amend the required documentation for workers' compensation insurance to be consistent with the statutory language.
- **12 AAC 21.090. Negotiable security in place of surety bond,** is amended to bring the language to current statutory requirements that took effect January 1, 2015.
- 12 AAC 21.110. Prohibitions, is proposed to be amended to clarify language for prohibitions of performing contractor work without an active registration, and the use of terms that describe the business of a contractor.

- 12 AAC 21.120. Cash deposits instead of bond, is proposed to be amended to clarify the language for a cash deposit, and remove a requirement for release of a mature certificate of deposit.
- 12 AAC 21.130. Claims against cash deposits, is proposed to be amended to clarify language and update a statute citation.
- 12 AAC 21.140. Payment of claims against a cash deposit, is proposed to be amended to clarify language and bring outdated wording up to current regulatory standards.
- **12 AAC 21.160. Violation of bonding or insurance requirements,** is proposed to be amended by adding "the" to Administrative Procedure Act.
- **12 AAC 21.260. Communications contractor,** is proposed to be amended by changing "telephone" to "communications".
- 12 AAC 21.540. Water and sewer contractor, is proposed to be amended by adding "septic tanks" to the scope of a water and sewer contractor.
- 12 AAC 21.600. Mechanical contractor, is proposed to be amended to clarify that a licensed mechanical administrator must be licensed in the same category and assigned to a mechanical contractor registration for which the work or submission of bids is for.
- **12 AAC 21.660.** Acceptable continuing competency activities, is proposed to be amended to update a name of an agency offering continuing competency activities, and allow certain agencies to provide continuing competency activities without having to submit documentation for department approval.


