The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Education and Early Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Department of Education and Early Development after the close of the public comment period and concern amendment of 4 AAC to update requirements for English learner standardized testing requirements and resources as well as update 4 AAC 34.090 to replace references to the term "American Indian" with the term "Native American."

A number of technical edits are suggested in accordance with AS 44.62.125 and the Drafting Manual for Administrative Regulations. These corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations and none are substantive in nature.




