1. Vendor: What is the project schedule?

Department: The RFP schedule set out herein represents the Department's best estimate of the schedule that will be followed. If a component of this schedule, such as contract execution, is delayed, the rest of the schedule may be shifted accordingly. Calendar days are used unless otherwise noted.

2. Vendor: Is CRW precluded from submitting since we did the PER?

3. Vendor: What is the page limit for the Project Team Experience Section?

4. Vendor: Is a Letter of Transmittal requested? (RFP has conflicting information.)

Department: Offerors must include a cover letter that provides a brief high level overview of the offerors firm. The cover letter must include a statement that the offeror meets Request for Proposal, Statement of Services, Appendix B, section 1.2 Minimum Requirements.

5. Vendor: I am wondering what is the water source for Emmonak? The reason I'm asking is we currently have a water well drilling rig there working on the anode wells for the new dock facility. It will not be leaving until the first barge in the spring/summer. So, if there is a need for water well(s) we would be available until that time period and the mobilization is all ready paid for!.

Department: Emmonak's water source is currently a surface water source, Kwiguk Pass, a channel of the Yukon River.
