VI. Approval of Agenda

Jimmy Coopchiak moved to approve agenda, second by Thomas Dock, approved unanimously.

VII. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes
AC failed to draft, deferred to next meeting, Walter K will draft.

VIII. Elections:

Elections held for one Togiak designated seat, two undesignated seats, and two alternate seats with terms that expired in June 2021.

Nominations opened for Togiak designated seat, Jimmy Coophiak nominated Roger Wassillie, no further nominations. Jimmy moved the committee seat Roger and asked for unanimous consent. Roger seated through June 30, 2024, with none opposed.

Nominations opened for two undesignated seats, Walter Kanulie nominated Jimmy Coopchiak and Lester Moore, no further nominations were made. Walter moved the committee seat Jimmy and Lester and asked for unanimous consent. Nominees seated through June 30, 2024, with none opposed.

Nominations opened for two Alternates, Thomas Dock nominates himself and Terri

Evette. No further nominations were made. Jimmy moved the committee seat the nominees and asked for unanimous consent. Nominees seated through June 30, 2024, with none opposed.

IX. Updates

a. Chair's report: Moses K. commented that he would like to step down as chairman, also saying he had been chairman since the inception of the AC. Walter K. made a motion to nominate Peter Lockuk as chairman. Peter Lockuk commented that he has been getting hard of hearing, concerned that it may interfere with important decisions and will need help from the others, members agree to help. Walter K. asked for unanimous consent (UC), motion carried.

Peter L. was secretary, Moses K open for nomination of new secretary, Jimmy C. nominated Walter K. and asked for UC, motion carried.

Walter K. was the Vice Chair, Moses K opened for nomination V.C, Jimmy C. nominated Joe Alexie and asked for unanimous consent, motion carried.

b. ADF&G and staff updates

Tim Sands (Comm Fish AMB)

Season summary and forecast available at website

King Salmon not doing well statewide, ADF&G don't really understand why. People encourage to use smaller net gear. Trawlers out by Round Island bycatch mostly halibut, no salmon species, no information about trawlers elsewhere. Jimmy C. said the Togiak commercial fisherman had been following King Salmon conservation regulation for subsistence since declining King returns. He mentioned the sports fishing industry in the Togiak river have no conservation regulations in place. Tim S. responded that the AC group submit proposals, Jimmy C asked for Cody Larson (BBNA) to help AC in forming a proposal for sports fishing industry.

Ed Wilber asked Tim S about the transfer date of other east bay fisherman to Togiak bay. TS responded the transfer date (July 27) is because someone wanted it to go entirely. Taryn will let Ed W know; AC will set a date to go back to his question about the commercial fisheries question.

Moses K asked Tim S on how long Togiak fishermen have been on King conservation?

Tim S said Kings are not so productive as they used to be. Moses K would like see more research, Tim S countered don't have budget, suggested AC talk to Senators and Representatives. Ed W asked Tim S if there was a long-term solution in the future? Tim S said observers general feeling is its cyclical with ocean conditions. Spawning habitat is in good shape, don't have solution for ocean. Ed W asked about guidance on what sort of proposals? Hatcheries? Tim S would not suggest hatcheries. Moses K asked about the chum salmon being in decline for the past 3 years? Tim S agreed, Nushagak and all of western Alaska has same decline, points to something in the ocean has changed,

hoping its cyclical, no one knows for sure. Early life history for young salmon in the ocean, predation?, some specie goes up and another goes down. Moses K had a question on area M about same species, Tim S said even less down there, he said he will look into for next meeting.

Chris Brockman-Wildlife

He said area 17B is closed, 17A moose hunt is open until January 20, 2022. Wants AC to look at proposal to reauthorize management for 17A. Jimmy C asked Chris about moose count, he answered last count in Refuge was 2017. Andy Aderman had numbers: 2017 survey @ 2400 moose, 2019 survey @ 2100 moose. Andy A hopes to have another count March 2022. Moses K asked Andy about count being low and if it was predation. Andy said moose management plan goal is 800 to 1200 moose, and when it doubled started to try bring down by harvest, some predation by bear and wolves. Calf survival down in 17A and Goodnews area throughout summer even though calves are many. So combination of harvest and lack of survival for down count. Moses asked about proxy hunting, Chris B believes antlerless moose and one antlered is ok to proxy.

Joe Wittkop-AWT

Togiak herring season violations-few crew with no license.

Joint enforcement with Federal on yellowfin sole trawling.

Spring bear hunts with guides, no violations observed.

Sport fishing has limited funding to observe, have spot checks, observed not many violations.

Commercial Fishing, they had vessel patrol in bay and aerial surveillance of closed bays and during closed periods. Observed on crew member was fishing permit while permit holder was in Anchorage and suggested processors need to verify. Some setnets were beyond max distance, they need to respect regulations.

Fall hunting 2021, one sublegal moose and one cow taken, mentioned salvage bear kills still a struggle.

Winter moose hunt is still on going, conditions ok in spite of the rain.

Joe W said the SOA launched a new Anonymous reporting for Fish and Game violations called AKtips. (computer/app based for cellphones, not a call In procedure)

Jimmy C asked about Yellowfin sole bycatch, Joe W said they inspect catches and licensing, open holds & check labeling, didn't see King salmon bycatch, saw halibut and cod, doesn't have numbers on bycatch because they get turned over to the federal side. Moses K asked about the AKtip. Thomas D asked about where to find trawler regulations. NOAA and National Marine Fisheries were mentioned for trawlers.

Roger W brought up King salmon management and that the numbers of them caught need to be monitored, should ask for historical numbers of kings since when the conservation line in Togiak bay was put in place, suggested sonar counts and also get

bycatch numbers from trawlers.

Cody L from BBNA offered his phone number and will help with proposals.

Roger W said conservation efforts have been made by local fishermen by following regulations and gear size, there needs to be counts on returning Kings and not just catch and management needs to be in area and more regulations on sports fishing.

Tim S came back from call, they have been talking to sport fish side, wants AC to reach out to sports fishing industry and ask for surveys and other things, call legislative representatives and share some funding base.

Ed W asked about sport fishing catch logs, and Tim S responded that it was axed as soon as Dunleavy got into office.

Moses K said of the discussion on King salmon for area are all valid and would like to see more data from the sport fishing industry. Tim S will pass on to "Lee" for next meeting.

Joe Alexie comment that a local from Togiak observed gutted salmon floating on river and was mentioned in a previous AC meeting and has not seen anything come of incident.

Thomas D mentioned that caribou was closed and asked about the numbers. Chris B said current estimates on Mulchatna is 13000 and they want to see 30000. He said the eastern herd seems stable, but the western section is declining and are looking at calves survival rate and likely no hunting next year either.

Andy A reported about the Nushagak peninsula herd; last July count was 258 caribou up from last year. estimate is 287 currently, calf count many and seems to be rebounding. Planning committee is meeting in July 2022. Aug 1 to March 15 has 8 permits available 4 for Manokotak, 2 for Aleknagik, 2 for Dillingham so far no harvest.

Ken N asked about survival rate, Andy A said 50 calves per 100 cows October observation so really good for that time of year.
