The attached eight pages of regulations, dealing with electrical administrator licensing, continuing education, and examinations, are adopted and certified to be a correct copy of the regulation changes that the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development adopts under the authority of AS 08.40.045, AS 08.40.050, AS 08.40.090, AS 08.40.110, AS 08.40.120, AS 08.40.135, AS 08.40.150, AS 08.40.170, and AS 08.40.195, and after compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62), specifically including notice under AS 44.62.190 and 44.62.200 and opportunity for public comment under AS 44.62.210.

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development after the close of the public comment period. The regulations concern examination, education, and experience requirements for electrical administrators and categories of electrical administrators, streamline certain reporting requirements, and strike obsolete text.

The April 12, 2021 public notice and the March 16, 2022 adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.

LICENSING IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE,  
COMMUNITY, AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

**BRIEF DESCRIPTION:** The Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development proposes changes to the regulations for licensing, continuing education, and examinations.

The Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development (Department) proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 12, Chapter 32 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with electrical administrator licensing, including the following:

**12 AAC 32.015. Application for licensure by examination**, is proposed to be amended to update the name of the examination provider and requirements for certificates in support of the applicant's qualifications and experience.

**12 AAC 32.025. Application for licensure by credentials**, is proposed to amend the requirements for certificates in support of the applicant's qualifications and experience.

**12 AAC 32.035. License renewal**, is proposed to amend the continuing education requirements by allowing certification of compliance on the renewal form.

**12 AAC 32.055. Qualifications for an electrical administrator license in the unlimited linework category**, is proposed to be amended by adding an additional way to obtain the qualifying experience.

**12 AAC 32.125. Scope of electrical administrator license in the outside communications category**, is proposed to be amended by removing the term "telegraph" from the authorized scope of work.

**12 AAC 32.145. Qualifications for an electrical administrator license in the unlimited commercial wiring category**, is proposed to be amended by adding an additional way to obtain the qualifying experience.

**12 AAC 32.195. Scope of an electrical administrator license in the inside communications category**, is proposed to be amended by removing the term "telegraph" from the authorized scope of work.

**12 AAC 32.345. Report of continuing education**, is proposed to be amended by removing the requirement to list the continuing education courses on the renewal form.

**12 AAC 32.995. Definitions**, is proposed to amend the definition for "division".

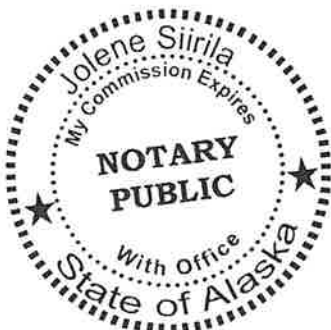
