Questions submitted by offerors and answers from the State:

Question 1: I do have a couple of questions about deliverable 5.b. in Section 3.03. 5.b. Inventory of trails, river routes and access points within the planning area with travel assessments of each to include potential modes of access,

Has DNR or ADFG already completed the field work necessary for inventorying the trails, rivers, and access points? Or does this field work need to be completed by the contractor? If by the contractor, are there guidelines or standards that are required for data collection? Ex. GPS standards?

- <u>Answer 1</u>: The contract does not require an inventory requiring field work or survey level requirements as they are not needed for this type of plan. The effort is expected to be an inventory of existing information from State, Federal, and Local sources in addition to information gathered from the public during scoping for the plans. The DNR has some trail information and will share what is available from the State and other sources while working with the contractor to ensure State planning requirements are met.
- <u>Question 2</u>: Is the inventory intended to be location/geospatial information only or is a condition assessment also desired?
- <u>Answer 2</u>: The contractor would conduct reconnaissance level condition assessments, supplementing the assessments with agency and public input gathered during scoping for the plans.
