QUESTIONS SUBMITTED BY OFFERORS AND ANSWERS FROM THE STATE

Question 1: What happens if we go out and grab all said items - we are planning on putting skiffs and

dock, junk, etc, whatever we can't fit onto the vessel and towing all that to my giant trailer for storage, RIGHT??? Now the 20 days are up or it's not 20 days and they reclaim their stuff - HOW DO THEY GET IT BACK???? Do we take it back to them???? At the very

least I need my trailer back!!! What happens????

Answer 1: In the event the owner wants to reclaim their stuff, they will need to work with the DNR to

determine what fees must be paid for repossession. If the DNR agrees to release the vessel to the owner, the vessel must be made available for repossession, the salvage company is not obligated to return the vessel to the original location. Practically speaking, if the vessel has been removed from the water and is sitting on a trailer, putting the vessel back in the

water at the nearest launch would be appropriate.

Question 2: The big vessel will be stored and disabled for 20 days in an undisclosed location in water

WE THINK??? Now - they Reclaim it??? WHAT HAPPENS????

<u>Answer 2</u>: The owner is responsible for moving the vessel to an acceptable location.

Question 3: Basically the big ask is are we (The Salvage Co.) responsible for getting the stuff back to

them or are you (DNR)???

Answer 3: DNR is responsible for coordinating what fees must be paid by the owner and setting up an

acceptable time for repossession. The salvage company will not be responsible for returning

the stuff to its original location.
