Chapter 68. Board of Veterinary Examiners.

12 AAC 68 is amended by adding a new section to read:

- 12 AAC 68.043. Temporary military courtesy license. (a) The board will issue a temporary military courtesy license to an active duty military member or spouse of an active duty military member of the armed forces of the United States to practice as a veterinarian or veterinary technician to an applicant who meets the requirements of AS 08.01.063 and this section not later than 30 days after the board receives a completed application.
 - (b) An applicant for a temporary military courtesy license under this section
 - (1) must submit an application on a form provided by the department;
- (2) must pay the temporary license application fee and fee for a temporary license set out under 12 AAC 02.105;
 - (3) must submit a copy of
 - (A) the applicant's current active duty military orders showing assignment to a duty station in this state; or
 - (B) if the applicant is the spouse of an active duty military member, the applicant's spouse's current active duty military orders showing assignment to a duty station in this state;
- (4) must submit documentation showing the applicant is currently licensed and in good standing in another licensing jurisdiction and the applicant's license in the other jurisdiction is not suspended, revoked, or otherwise restricted except for failure to apply for renewal;
- (5) must demonstrate that the jurisdiction of current licensure required the education in AS 08.98.165(a)(1) or 12 AAC 68.310(b)(4)(A), as applicable, as a condition of licensure;

- (6) must demonstrate that the jurisdiction of current licensure required a passing examination score as shown on the form required under 12 AAC 68.035(a)(6) or 12 AAC 68.315(a), as applicable, as a condition of licensure; and
- (7) may not have been convicted of a crime that affects the applicant's ability to practice veterinary medicine or as a veterinary technician competently and safely, as determined by the board.
- (c) A temporary military courtesy license issued to an active duty military member or spouse of an active duty military member under this section will be issued for a period of 180 days and may be renewed for one additional 180-day period, at the discretion of the board.
- (d) While practicing under a temporary military courtesy license issued under this section, the holder of the temporary military courtesy license must comply with the standards of practice set out in AS 08.98 and this chapter.
- (e) The board may refuse to issue a temporary military courtesy license for the same reasons that it may deny, suspend, or revoke a license under AS 08.98.235 or 12 AAC 68.048.

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulation.

The regulations concern establishing standards and a process for applying for a temporary military courtesy license to practice veterinary medicine or as a veterinary technician.

The Board of Veterinary Examiners adopted the regulation after the close of the public comment period. Both the April 15, 2022 public notice and the August 25, 2022 certifying order state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.
