

Notice of Utility Application

The REGULATORY COMMISSION OF ALASKA (Commission) gives notice that on December 30, 2022, Juneau Hydropower, Inc. (JHI) filed an application for a new certificate of public convenience and necessity. JHI proposes to provide new hydroelectrical generation service and high-voltage transmission service initially to industrial mining customers in the City and Borough of Juneau, Alaska. Docket No. U-22-095 was opened to address this matter.

A person who proposes to file an application to furnish the same, or substantially the same, service or facility to essentially the same service area or route, in whole or in part, thus creating the potential for mutually exclusive applications must file a notice of intent to file a competing application by February 10, 2023. The person must then file the competing application by April 11, 2023. If no notice of intent to file a competing application is filed by February 10, 2023, the Commission will proceed to grant or deny the application.

In conjunction with its application, JHI has filed a petition for confidential treatment of certain financial and contractual information filed in support of the application, along with diagrams containing critical energy infrastructure information protected by federal law. Interested persons may file a response to JHI's petition for confidential treatment with the Commission by 5:00 p.m., February 1, 2023.

JHI also filed a petition for exemption from economic regulation under AS 42.05.711(d). Economic regulation means regulation of matters concerning a utility's rates and charges, quality of service, management practices, and customer complaints. If granted an exemption, the Commission would have no jurisdiction over these aspects of JHI's electric utility service. The Commission has the authority to grant's JHI's request in its entirety, or in part.

The Commission has not assessed the completeness of the application or ruled on the petition for confidential treatment. The Commission will rule on the petition for confidential treatment and determine whether the application is complete by March 3, 2023.


