### Additional Actions:

The board approved the department's [Nushagak River King Salmon Action Plan](#) with the following amendments: [RC 53](#) was adopted as a substitute for the proposed actions in the subsistence, sport, and commercial fisheries. The board further clarified they retain the delisting criteria from the Action Plan, rather than the delisting criteria in the regulatory language of RC 53.

### Miscellaneous Business:

The board scheduled a special meeting to consider a proposal from the Native Village of Kwinhagak that was received on time but inadvertently lost during the process of organizing the proposal book for the 2022/2023 meeting cycle. This proposal was provided to the board as [RC 92](#). The meeting is proposed for April 19, 2023 beginning at 4:30 p.m. and will be held electronically via Zoom and streamed live via YouTube. Only written comments will be accepted for this special meeting and will be accepted through April 7, 2023.

The board considered three emergency petitions relating to the commercial set gillnet fishery in Upper Cook Inlet. These petitions were [RC 3](#), [RC 4](#), and [RC 33](#). In each petition, the board did not find that an emergency existed by a vote of 1-5.

The board adopted a finding ([2023-303-FB](#)) in relation to their establishment of Optimal Escapement Goals for Nushagak River sockeye salmon in order to conserve king salmon.

The board considered a draft policy ([RC 90](#)) for the establishment of Optimal Escapement Goals. A motion was made to table this to the board's October 2023 work session.

The board discussed the need to develop consistent processes and timelines for the development of escapement goal and stock of concern recommendations, and when they should be available for public input. There will likely be further discussion on this topic in the board's Committee on Board Process.
