## Resolution to Protect Yukon River Chinook Salmon

WHEREAS, Yukon River Chinook Salmon are an extremely critical species for the continuation of cultural practices for Yukon River Tribes, and other long time subsistence users.

WHEREAS, Age 7 fish now make up 1% and age 6 fish now make up 29% of the Yukon River Chinook run, with age 7 fish and age 6 fish 30% and 50% respectively.

WHEREAS, This has resulted in huge drops in the number of Chinook eggs reaching the spawning grounds.

WHEREAS, For the past 4 years we have not met our escapement goals in violation of our treaty with Canada.

WHEREAS, There is no outlook for any change in the near future due to present practices, despite no fishing for subsistence users and no commercial fishing on the Yukon river for 10 years.

WHEREAS, Food Security is an ever increasing necessity due to lack of any Chinook Salmon available to Yukon River families and their well being both mentally and physically.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we Request the National Marine Fisheries Service, NOAA and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to declare Yukon River Chinook Salmon a threatened species.
