# MOBILE DRIVER LICENSE (mDL) SYSTEM

### Introduction:

The Department of Administration, Division of Motor Vehicles, is seeking information from qualified vendors who provide Mobile Driver License (mDL) system.

## **Background Information:**

The State of Alaska, Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) has decided to pursue offering the mobile driver license (mDL) option in addition to the traditional card option. An mDL is a driver's license that is provisioned to a mobile device with the capability to be updated in real time. It is comprised of the same data elements that are used to produce a physical driver's license, however, the data may be transmitted electronically to a relying party's reader device and authenticated.

This system should be designed using resources including (but not limited to) the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators (AAMVA) Mobile Driver's License Implementation Guidelines, published in January of 2023, as well as the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) minimum standards for driver's licenses and identification cards acceptable by federal agencies for official purposes (attached for reference are: mDL-Implementation guideline and DHS Minimum Standards for DL and ID cards).

- 1. Business name, contact name, mailing address, phone number, and e-mail of designated point of contact;
- 2. Existing capableness and competence related to the services identified above to include answers to the RFI Questionnaire; and
- 3. Responses provided in PDF formats, including any supplemental attachments.

- 1. Please provide a general and benchmark cost for your mDL system.
- 2. Provide a general overview of the product service experience with your mDL system.
- 3. Provide any software or special software or hardware needs for the mDL system.
- 4. What performance guarantees do you include with your mDL system?

DOA does not intend to award a contract from this RFI, nor will DOA be financially responsible for the preparation, or administration cost incurred to respond to this RFI.
