#### Addendum # One (1)

This addendum forms a part of the contract documents and modifies the original drawings and/or specifications for the subject work. In case of conflicts between this addendum and previously issued documents, this addendum shall take precedence.

#### The following administrative changes have been made to this IFQ:

- 1. This addendum is being issued to update existing information on page 4 of this solicitation.
  - a. SECTION 01 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS
    - i. PART 1 GENERAL, 1.03 WORK COVER BY CONTRACT B.
      - 1. Update *hangar doors* to reflect *overhead cranes*.
- 2. This addendum is being issued to update existing information on page 7 of this solicitation.
  - a. SMALL PROCUREMENT QUOTE SUBMITTAL
    - i. Block 5
      - 1. Update hangar doors to reflect overhead cranes.

#### **Questions and Answers:**

1. After reviewing the SOW, I noticed there were no scissor lifts or manlifts (MEWP's) included in the SOW. Do we have to provide or rent our own to perform these inspections? Additionally, does DMVA FMO have their own MEWP's that we can use, and if so, would we also be performing annual inspections on these as well?

- A. All Mobile Elevated Work Platform's (MEWP's) must be provided by the contracted vendor. No non-Alaskan State Employee can use DMVA FMO lifts, as this provides another level of risk the state cannot be held liable for if injury were to occur.
- 2. Per section 1.03 WORK COVERED BY CONTRACT: If repair cannot be completed at time of inspection due to parts needed, what are the alliterative actions offered? In this case the equipment would need to be locked out and placed out of service until parts and repairs can be completed. Because of the availability of parts and location of equipment this could take some time.
  - A. If required maintenance cannot be performed due to no available parts on hand and the lead time is set for a later date, then yes, the equipment will be locked out and placed out of service until repairs can be made. If this does occur, the contracted vendor shall immediately notify the project manager and inform them of the situation.
- 3. Per section 1.04 CONTRACT TERM AND PAYMENT PROVISIONS: I don't see a section for hourly maintenance or repair work in the pricing index. What is your expectation of maintenance? Can you list the items you would like included in the maintenance?
  - A. Maintenance is only to be performed if the equipment in question is not in compliance with any applicable safety code. If maintenance is required to get the equipment functioning and to meet any of these applicable safety codes, the contracted vendor may charge these services as an hourly rate and then submit a quote which is itemized by time, material and labor costs. Specific maintenance requirements are to be determined by the contracted vendors certified technician only if equipment is inoperative due to any safety concerns.
