TYPE OF GEAR USED:

STATISTICAL AREA WORKSHEET:

- 1) the species that are caught and discarded are equally distributed across all statistical areas fished; and
- 2) all statistical areas fished are open to the species fished.

ITEMIZING YOUR CATCH ON THE FISH TICKET:

DELIVERY CONDITION CODE (DELIV. CODE):

DISPOSITION CODES (DISP. CODE):

Sold, Overage, Discard or Personal Use.

POUNDS:

The landed weight (scale weight) in pounds. Harvest sold or discarded may not be entered on a groundfish ticket in metric tons.

Prohibited species must be identified and recorded on the fish ticket as each animal and, if possible, as pounds. Please indicate or label the entry for Prohibited Species as "Ea" for "Each" or "Lb" for "Pounds."

Harvest retained for bait or personal use consumption must be recorded in pounds on the fish ticket.

PRICE:

CDQ NUMBER (IF APPLICABLE):

The Community Development Corporation code number must be provided if the landing originates from a CDQ harvest.
