COMMERCIAL KNOWLEDGE TESTING SYSTEM

Introduction:

The Department of Administration (DOA), Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV), is seeking information from qualified vendors who could provide an "off-the-shelf" automated commercial knowledge testing system/product.

Background Information:

The State of Alaska (SOA), DMV is looking to upgrade knowledge testing product at their field office locations. In this process, DMV requests vendors to note any levels of customization, particularly those related to branding within the testing interface. The product must emphasize commercial knowledge content and seamlessly integrate with DMV's current learning management systems and platforms. Additionally, it should be capable of interfacing test results and other related data with DMV's transactional and records systems.

DMV is also interested in exploring the potential for integration with any third-party authentication systems to verify user identities.

Hardware requirements are flexible, and can include touch-screen user interfaces, mouse/keyboard-driven solutions, and/or combination of technologies. DMV will consider the idea of any other key features and functionalities available within the commercial knowledge testing system. Any installed software must be licensed, secure, and uphold the integrity of both the content and results, while also being widely accessible and equitable for users of all abilities.

Given the geographical dispersion of DMV's field office locations, the vendor must consider logistical challenges in delivering hardware. The vendor should elaborate on how the system can efficiently handle scalability and varying levels of user traffic and test volume.

Response Information:

Responses must include the following:

1. Organization name, contact name, mailing address, phone number, and email of designated point of contact;

- 2. Details on their experience, qualifications, products, or services related to the request, and note why their products or services will work for the division and for the State; and
- 3. Responses must be in PDF format, including any supplemental attachments.

This RFI does not extend any rights to prospective vendors or obligate the state to conduct a solicitation or purchase any goods or services. DOA does not intend to award a contract from this RFI, nor will DOA be financially responsible for the preparation, or administration cost incurred to respond to this RFI. All costs associated with responding will be at the sole discretion of any interested party's expense.

Notice to Vendors:
