







## Funding for SESA

Revenues by Source FY2024 Budget




## State of Alaska Funding: Fund 100 Low Incidence Disabilities



Total Statewide Enrollment (ADM) in FY2024 (5-pager) x \$23.13 per student = SESA's Total Funding for FY2025 LID Program


#### ADM and Student LID Caseload

Senate Bill 19- Alaska Legislature recommended legislature extend SESA's termination date to June 30,2029




SESA undergoes an audit by Alaska Legislature Division of Legislative Audit. Title 24 and Title 44 of Alaska Statutes

Does SESA serve the public's interest by assisting school districts in providing students affected by low incidence disabilities?

## Since August 2023

SESA has provided technical assistance to over 18,894 Alaskans.

SESA programs have offered over 106 site-based, district, and state-wide trainings for Alaskans on evidence-based or best practices related to the educational program of students with low-incidence disabilities.

Over 47% of these trainings were conducted via distance delivery (e.g., Zoom).

SESA Low Incidence Disability
Programs and Alaska Deafblind Project have offered and provided support to 531 students and their school teams.

SESA has produced 580 customized student or patron-focused reports offering recommendations and guidance.

SESA specialists have provided 956 student consultations, 135 site consultations, and 150 resource consultations to Alaskans.

Alaska Center of Accessible Materials has created or located 26 accessible educational materials projects for school teams and their students with print disabilities. It takes an average of 7 hours to interview or observe the student and locate appropriate AEM per student team.

Alaska Autism Resource Center has conducted 18 community outreach activities.



## Satisfaction Surveys

Participants of SESA technical assistance are invited to complete a satisfaction survey after service is provided.

Preferred Mode of Service Delivery: 167 out of 182 respondents to the LID Site Survey shared that they would prefer on-site services.

Additional Responses Include:
55 requested video conferencing
14 requested website resources
11 requested teleconferences
7 requested remote observations
7 did not provide a response

Out of 980 distance, site, and training satisfaction surveys completed across all programs, 93.36% responded that they gained knowledge from the consultation or training provided by SESA.

### Alaska Deafblind Project in Action

In January, AKDBP offered a training on Proprioception & Neuromuscular Orientation & Mobility techniques, taught by a nationally known presenter, over Zoom and in-person. Those who attended were able to take the skills they learned and apply them, directly benefiting Alaskan students.

#### AKCAM in Action

When working with a team to support a student either in person or via distance delivery, AKCAM looks at three areas: vision, processing or perceptual skills, and physical access. The Alaska Center for Accessible Materials can convert instructional materials to accessible formats, such as braille, large print, and digital text and audio.


