Dear Lieutenant Governor Dahlstrom:

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Board of Game against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This letter constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Board of Game after the close of the public comment period.

The regulations concern the harvest of game in the Eastern Arctic Region.

The Board of Game would like these regulations in effect as close as possible to July 1, when many harvest seasons start for the agency regulatory year. Accordingly, we respectfully request that these regulations be filed as soon as possible.

The December 10, 2023 public notice and the June 4, 2024 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.060 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.060. The corrections are incorporated into the attached copy of the regulations.
